SAFETY CULTURE TRANSFORMATION

As we continue to see an increase in visible awareness to safety and safe work practices such as "safety starts here" banners, logos - even work uniforms - this visible awareness is not enough. While total non-fatal <u>recordable</u> injuries continue to decline year over year, <u>serious and fatal</u> injuries are increasing during the same time.

Traditional "old thoughts" of classification, tracking, presenting, and communicating safety incident events are not effective in preventing serious and fatal events from occurring. The traditional safety triangle is not an accurate representation of serious events.

TRAINING OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Develop an understanding of "Active Caring".
- 2. Knowledge of key Health and Safety Performance Metrics.
- How to communicate safety metrics to leadership with attention to serious injuries and fatalities (actual and potential).
- 4. Importance of *Personal Safety Commitments* throughout the organization.
- 5. Develop a structured *Behavior Safety Engagement Program* "Walk and Talk".
- 6. How to implement a "Stop Work Authority Program".
- 7. How to track behavior safety progress with business performance.

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A strong safety culture needs to transition beyond a simple, passive concern and move toward actively demonstrating care for others. Caring about safety is a good start but "actively caring" means going above and beyond what is required or mandated and going to great lengths to ensure the well-being and safety of others in the workplace. This must begin at the top of the leadership team.
