

What You Should Know

- Know what to do before, during, and after a disaster.
- Identify your risks. Know what disasters are most likely to affect your business.
- Develop a workplace emergency plan and be sure employees know it.
- Create a crisis communications plan to keep in contact with customers, suppliers and employees during and after a disaster.
- Test and practice your preparedness plans.
- Have emergency supplies available at the workplace.
- Check your insurance policies to ensure you have enough coverage.
- · Listen to local officials.

Why Do You Work Safely?

Zoom in on the <u>"Focus Four"</u>

Four hazards account for the majority of work-related fatalities. Therefore, OSHA continues to focus on these issues during inspections (and in many cases these issues actually prompt inspections). The "Focus Four" are:

- Falls
- Struck by object
- Electrocutions
- Caught-in/between

Be on the lockout for these hazards in your work operations. Aside from OSHA enforcement ramifications, these hazards can seriously injure or kill workers.
